Spend the day with WILL at the Mimbres Heritage Culture Site. We will see how an archeology lab functions and learn about Mimbreno culture, as well as visit the Harris Site (Mimbres Late Pithouse Period), located in the Mimbres Valley. The Site holds an estimated 100 pithouses. It was partially excavated in the 1930s by Emil Haury and was a "type site" used to define the Mogollon Culture. We will join a group of graduate archeology students from the University of Nevada- Las Vegas to learn the process of the dig and what discoveries they have made during their summer field assignment
