Drawing and Painting Outdoors: Rita Sherwood will lead this class in creating landscape art in the medium of the students' choice. The class meets on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. till noon beginning on June 9th.

Mimbres Cultural Heritage Site Tour: About a thousand years ago, a Mimbres pueblo was built on top of an earlier pit house site on the banks of the Mimbres river. Join one of the two one-day tours of the site with Marylin Markle. An optional fireside dinner and conversation with the archeological students working on the site is also available. A few spaces are still available for the June 22 tour.



Bats of Grant County: This is not a course on the history of baseball in Grant County. Bats have a very important role in the ecology of Southwestern New Mexico, both in pollination of many native plants and in limiting the proliferation of insects. The many abandoned pits and shafts of the mines have provided homes for many bats. The facilitator for this one-day course June 10, is Jason Corbett, a member of Bat Conservation International.
