WILL Institute for Foreign Language Study (IFLS)

This fall WILL is offering a pilot language program featuring two Spanish language courses led by talented teachers of Spanish. This pilot is to study if there are enough language teachers and learners to sustain an ongoing language program at WILL, including other languages.

The fall courses will meet twice a week for 10 weeks, and will *require* some work outside class. Beginning Spanish (Valentina Watson, facilitator), and Intermediate Spanish (Patricia Cano, facilitator) will both meet Tuesday and Thursday, 1 - 2:30 pm beginning September 6, 2011.

These courses are open *only* to WILL members, and carry an additional cost over and above your WILL membership dues, for instructor fees and materials.

The cost for each class is \$75 (about \$2.30 an hour). Both classes will stress talking about interesting topics, stretching vocabularies, and improving pronunciation. "Beginning" means little or no experience with Spanish. "Intermediate" requires some recent practice or travel after college Spanish 101.

Archaeology of the Southwest with Dr. Stephen Lekson

Dr. Lekson is a well known writer, lecturer, archaeologist, and professor at the University of Colorado, Boulder. Most of his work has been in the Mogollon and Anasazi regions. He received his Ph.D. from the University of New Mexico in 1988. He is the author of numerous books including *A History of the Ancient Southwest*, *The Architecture of Chaco Canyon*, *Archaeology of the Mimbres Region*, *Southwestern New Mexico USA*, and *Chaco Meridan: Centers of Political Power in the Ancient Southwest*.

If you have any interest in the early cultures of the Southwest, this lecture is not to be missed.
